A number of **FACE-TO-FACE** workshops are offered throughout the year, COVID-regulations permitting. We have a number of local volunteer tutors and at times engage external facilitators to run a range of workshops covering a diverse topics and interests. REMOTE-SOCIAL-LOCAL:

a remote/digital workshop program introduced in response to the COVID- 19 Pandemic. This program allows for flexibility of access and has increased the participation and diversity of audience engaging with CCH programs. Remote Social Local will continue in 2022 and beyond, but at a lesser rate than in 2020 and 2021, mixing with the face-to-face workshops to provide a more holistic and variety of options to encourage engagement. Ongoing Services 2022

CCH No Interest Loans is an unfunded community partner with the No Interest Loans Scheme. We are here to provide information about the scheme and support in accessing and applying for the service. Done through NHVIC: <https://www.nhvic.org.au/forms/no-interest-loans-enquiry>

Device Advice Support to assist community members learning how to use their devices, phones, tablets and computers. Can include setting up MyGov and email etc. Volunteer tutors (and Coordinator) provide one on one or small group tutorials based on individual need. Appointments made by calling 55931043.

External Service Providers a number of visiting services provide their service from CCH, including Carer's Support, Job Seeker Support and counselling. These services are encouraged to use the consulting room (former Coordinator officer) but can use the meeting room or book the whole facility if providing the service outside of office hours.

Foodbank Emergency Food Relief Camperdown & District Community House is a registered agency with Food Bank Victoria and Warrnambool Food Share, and offers this service to the entire Corangamite Shire region. Non-perishable food hampers and non-food essential items, such as nappies and personal hygiene products, are available. Referral Support an informal information service provided on an as needs basis. Members of the community at times contact CCH for information about various support services. CCH is in the process of developing a service provider list for front of house volunteers to refer to. A more formal referral resource is currently in development. If the required information is not known, refer to Corangamite Shire Community Services, contact 5593 7100.

Room Hire CCH facility is available for hire by external parties. Consultation room ideal for one on one service provision or hot desk. Meeting room ideal for small to medium sized meetings and group activities. Our meeting room also has access to an undercover outdoor area and backyard that has access to the child-safe play area in APEX Park. **Contact us** for availability, room hire form and policy. COVID-safe protocols apply to facility hire and use.
